

Creates a Public Safety Fee for a Jail Operations Fund.

Question:

Should developed properties pay a Public Safety Fee annually for a Jail Operations Fund?

Summary:

Creates a Jail Operations Fund by establishing a Public Safety Fee of \$144.00 annually that is paid for by the responsible party of developed property.

The responsible party is the person having the right to occupy the property. The property owner of record is responsible to pay the fee if the person having the right to occupy refuses.

Developed property is property upon which improvements have been constructed.

The Public Safety Fee will begin July 1, 2014. The fee will be paid on all residential dwelling units, tenant spaces, and business units.

The Jail Operations Funds may only be used to pay for the operation, administration, maintenance, repair, improvement, renewal, replacement and reconstruction of jail areas in Klamath County. Three percent may be used for collection of the Public Safety Fee. The County Board of Commissioners may periodically adjust the Public Safety Fee to account for the cost of the allowed Fund expenditures.

A five member citizen committee appointed by the County Board of Commissioners is created to provide oversight of the Jail Operations Fund.
