## COVID-19 chronology

August 2020

### August 31, 2020

One new death brought Oregon's toll to 459. Oregon Health Authority reported 162 new confirmed and presumptive cases, bringing the state total to 26,713.

The cases were in the following counties: Clackamas (14), Coos (1), Crook (1), Deschutes (2), Hood River (1), Jackson (6), Lane (15), Lincoln (1), Linn (4), Malheur (9), Marion (36), Multnomah (34), Polk (6), Umatilla (6), Wasco (1), and Washington (25).

Oregon's 459th death was a 93-year-old man in Washington County who tested positive August 25 and died August 26 at his residence. He had underlying conditions.

At 2 p.m. Pacific Time there were 6,202,481 cases in the United States, with 3,438,919 recoveries and 187,583 deaths. Of the 2,575,979 active cases, 15,941 were critical. National testing reached 82,407,964, with the global tally at 442,498,365. Worldwide there were 25,547,152 cases, with 17,612,730 recoveries and 852,987 deaths. Of the 6,946,126 active cases, 61,135 were critical.

### August 30, 2020

Oregon's 458th death is a 79-year-old man in Marion County who tested positive July 30 and died August 28, at Salem Hospital. He had underlying conditions.

At 8:30 p.m. Pacific Time there were 6,173,236 cases in the United States, with 3,425,723 recoveries and 187,224 deaths. Of the 2,560,289 active cases, 15,996 were critical. National testing reached 81,830,079, with the global tally at 439,193,317. Worldwide there were 25,384,547 cases, with 17,493,852 recoveries and 850,591 deaths. Of the 6,880,580 active cases, 61,102 were critical.

### August 29, 2020

Oregon's 450th death was a 59-year-old woman in Multnomah County who tested positive August 1 and died August 21, at her residence. She had underlying conditions.

Oregon's 451st death was a 68-year-old woman in Multnomah County who tested positive August 14 and died August 21, at her residence. She had underlying conditions.

## August 28, 2020

Oregon's 441st death was a 73-year-old man in Umatilla County who tested positive Aug. 9 and died Aug. 23, at Kadlec Regional Medical Center in Richland, Washington.

Oregon's 444th death was a 73-year-old woman in Malheur County who died Aug. 1. The death certificate listed COVID-19 disease or SARS-CoV-2 as a cause of death or a significant condition contributing to death.

Oregon's 445th death was a 78-year-old man in Multnomah County who tested positive July 26 and died Aug. 15, at his residence. He had underlying conditions.

Oregon's 446th death was a 97-year-old woman in Malheur County who tested positive Aug. 11 and died Aug. 13, at St. Alphonsus Regional Medical Center in Boise, Idaho. She had underlying conditions.

Oregon's 447th death was a 29-year-old man in Multnomah County who tested positive Aug. 22 and died Aug. 22, at OHSU Hospital. He did not have underlying conditions.

An outbreak of 25 cases was reported at Milgard Windows and Doors in Washington County. The case count included all persons linked to the outbreak, such as household members and other close contacts to an employee.

The outbreak investigation started Aug. 21, but the initial case count was below the threshold for public disclosure. State and county public health officials were working with the company to address the outbreak and protect the health of workers.

At 12 p.m. Pacific Time there were 6,070,677 cases in the United States, with 3,353,371 recoveries and 185,327 deaths. National testing reached 79,849,034, with the global tally at 431,295,182. Worldwide there were 24,794,160 cases, with 16,997,055 recoveries and 838,554 deaths.

## August 27, 2020

Oregon's 387th death was an 86-year-old woman in Clackamas County who tested positive August 12 and died August 13, at Kaiser Sunnyside Medical Center. She had underlying conditions.

Oregon's 388th death was a 52-year-old woman in Multnomah County who tested positive August 5 and died August 14 at Providence Portland Medical Center. She had underlying conditions.

There was updated information on Oregon's 384th death. The death was a 73-year-old woman in Lane County who tested positive July 25 and died August 12 at McKenzie-Willamette Medical Center. She had underlying conditions.

The New York Times reported "daily tests trended downward for much of the last two weeks, essentially stalling the nation's testing response. Some 733,000 people have been tested each day this month on average, down from nearly 750,000 in July, according to the COVID Tracking Project. The seven-day test average dropped to 709,000 on Monday, the lowest in nearly a month, before ticking upward again at week's end."

The World Health Organization reported at 10 a.m. Central European Summer Time that there were 5,258,565 cases in the United States, with 167,201 deaths. Worldwide there were 21,294,845 cases with 761,779 deaths.

The outbreak investigation started August 1, but the initial case count was below the threshold for public disclosure. State and county public health officials were working with the company to address the outbreak and protect the health of workers.

Governor Kate Brown and the Oregon Health Authority issued revised guidance requiring face coverings or face shields for employees in private office spaces, in addition to public office spaces. The guidance requires face coverings in public and private building hallways, bathrooms, elevators, lobbies, break rooms, and other common spaces, unless employees are at individual work spaces or in meeting rooms where six feet of distance from other people can be maintained.

The revised guidance provided an exception for face coverings, allowing for the brief removal of face coverings in situations where someone's identity needed to be confirmed for visual comparison, such as interactions in banks or with law enforcement.

At 7 p.m. Pacific Time there were 5,476,266 cases in the United States, with 2,875,147 recoveries and 171,535 deaths. National testing reached 69,362,009, with the global tally at 380,779,308. Worldwide there were 21,342,162 cases, with 13,932,487 recoveries and 763,060 deaths.

According to a study published in the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's Morbidity and Mortality Weekly Report (MMWR), as of mid-June, 1% of Oregonians without COVID-19 had evidence of past infection of the virus in their blood, which is 10 times higher than the reported rate of infections obtained through conventional testing.

Oregon Health Authority epidemiologists authored the study, which found that nine of 897 blood specimens collected from 19 health care facilities around Oregon between May 11 and June 15, 2020, contained antibodies against the virus that causes COVID-19.

The study also suggested that rates of infection increased with age, with no antibodies detected in the blood of pediatric patients 17 and younger. The rate was 0.4-0.5% in those ages 18-64; and 1.6-2.1% in those 65 and older.

The percentage of positive tests also decreased to 5.4%, and hospitalizations plateaued. The age group most affected by the virus remained 20-29, although the elderly were the hardest hit age group. Persons 80 or older account for nearly half of all those hospitalized.

Most cases continue to be sporadic, meaning there is no known source, which is an indication the virus was widespread.

When a death is reported to a county, the county may not always have the cause of death, which means a death initially might not be counted as a COVID-19 related death. During data reconciliation by OHA, additional COVID-19 related deaths may be found and reported. The deaths reported today included eight deaths that were identified during this review process.

At 2:30 p.m. Pacific Time there were 4,851,312 cases in the United States, with 2,431,333 recoveries and 158,743 deaths. National testing reached 60,808,353, and the global tally was 346,680,397. Worldwide there were 18,385,254 cases, with 11,401,911 recoveries and 695,381 deaths.

### August 2, 2020

Another death brought Oregon's toll to 326. Oregon Health Authority reported 285 new confirmed and presumptive cases, bringing the state total to 19,097.

The cases were in the following counties: Benton (1), Clackamas (26), Clatsop (2), Deschutes (8), Douglas (4), Hood River (4), Jackson (15), Jefferson (7), Josephine (2), Lane (7), Linn (4), Malheur (10), Marion (53), Morrow (8), Multnomah (48), Polk (2), Sherman (1), Tillamook (4), Umatilla (20), Wasco (3), Washington (47), and Yamhill (9).

Oregon's 326th death was a 68-year-old man in Malheur County who tested positive June 29 and died July 30, at Legacy Emanuel Medical Center. He had underlying conditions.

At 6:20 p.m. Pacific Time there were 4,813,640 cases in the United States, with 2,380,212 recoveries and 158,365 deaths. National testing reached 59,935,508, with the global tally at 344,074,707. Worldwide there were 18,226,592 cases, with 11,233,408 recoveries and 692,420.

### August 1, 2020

Three deaths brought Oregon's toll to 325. Oregon Health Authority reported 330 new confirmed and presumptive cases, bringing the state total to 18,817.

Oregon's 323rd death was an 86-year-old man in Washington County who tested positive July 14 and died July 31, at his residence. He had underlying conditions.

Oregon's 324th death was a 73-year-old woman in Yamhill County who tested positive July 26 and died July 30, at Willamette Valley Medical Center. She had underlying conditions.

Oregon's 325th death was a 91-year-old woman in Deschutes County who tested positive July 12 and died July 28. She had underlying conditions.

At 7 p.m. Pacific Time there were 4,764,318 cases in the United States, with 2,362,903 recoveries and 157,898 deaths. National testing reached 59,226,909, while the global tally was 341,444,657. Worldwide there were 18,009,763 cases, with 11,119,954 recoveries and 688,596 deaths.
