



## KLAMATH COUNTY DOMESTIC WELL FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE GRANT

### FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

- Grant applications accepted online at [www.klamathcounty.org](http://www.klamathcounty.org) when another application cycle opens. Grant applications were accepted from April 1 – 30, 2022 for first cycle. Homeowners were notified with a grant approval or denial letter via email or mail.
- The Domestic Well Committee sifted through applications and supporting documents to recommend funding for each project/well/homeowner and Commissioners approved this amount. The grant funding amounts were allocated based on invoices/estimates submitted by homeowners.
- Applicants were eligible for issues that arose from the declared drought March 31, 2021 – Dec 31, 2021.
- Applications that were incomplete received a denial letter stating why they were ineligible. Incomplete applications resulted from no supporting estimates/invoices; no W9; or incomplete applications. These applications have a place reserved for the next grant cycle to complete the application/required documentation to receive grant funding.
- Applicants must have a qualified complaint on file with the Watermaster's office to be eligible for the grant program during the 2021 designated drought (3/31/21-12/31/21)
- The Klamath County Domestic Well Financial Assistance Grant Program Overview has eligibility criteria. Homeowners may include invoices for items not listed to be considered by the committee, these invoices may or may not be approved (this is to decrease the requests for reimbursement for items such as showers, laundry, new roads, tree removal, etc.)
- This grant is a **reimbursement** grant. Invoices must be submitted to the Klamath County Grant Manager and an individual grant agreement will be issued upon receipt of all invoices. Send invoices to [nparker@klamathcounty.org](mailto:nparker@klamathcounty.org)
- Applications that were granted/allocated funding received an approval letter from the County with the funding amount they will receive, based on the invoices and estimates they provided.
- If the invoice total is higher than the estimates/approval, homeowners may apply for a future application cycle asking for additional funding, until the \$40,000 County max has been reached for the domestic well.
